Joseph Edward Brazeau. (1812-1871)

NAME: BRAZEAU, Joseph Edward

Joseph Brazeau was born on March 10, 1812 at St. Louis. He married Marguerite Brabant the daughter of Metis leader Augustin Brabant and his wife Angelique Lucier, circa 1845 at Edmonton. Joseph Edward Brazeau was clerk and postmaster for the HBC at Fort Edmonton, Jasper House and Rocky Mountain House. He was of Spanish-French-Indian origin, and he spoke nine languages. He was very helpful to the Palliser Expedition as their interpreter.

In February, 1859, Captain John Palliser recorded these notes as his expedition included a visit with the chief trader at Rocky Mountain House:

"Mr. [Joseph] Brazeau had been for many years in the American fur trade; was a wonderful Indian linguist, and spoke Stoney, Sioux, Salteau, Cree, Blackfoot, and Crow, - six languages, five of which are totally distinct from one another. Being of an old Spanish family, and educated in the United States, he also spoke English, French, and Spanish fluently."
